Faculty of Social Sciences, Hong Kong Baptist University, Award for Outstanding Performance (Scholarly Work) in 2006-2007.

My essay (co-authored with Seet Chia Sing), titled "Migrant family drama revisited: Mainland Chinese immigrants in Singapore" and published in *Sojourn: Social Issues in Southeast Asia*, Vol. 18, no. 2, October 2003, was awarded the Michael Leifer Memorial Prize by Singapore's Institute of Southeast Asian Studies. The Michael Leifer Memorial Prize is given biennially to the best article to appear in the Institute's three journals: *ASEAN Economic Bulletin*, *Contemporary Southeast Asia*, and *Sojourn: Social Issues in Southeast Asia*, which publishes works by authors in social sciences and the humanities. The essay's selection is based on its originality, conceptual clarity and soundness, and general contribution to Southeast Asian scholarship. My essay was selected out of 97 articles published in the three journals in 2003 and 2004. Inaugurated in 2005, the Michael Leifer Memorial Prize is established in memory of the late Michael Leifer (1933-2001), Professor Emeritus in International Relations at the London School of Economics and Political Science and founding Director of the School's Asia Research Center. Regarded as the doyen of Southeast Asian studies, Professor Leifer published over 20 books and 150 scholarly articles on the international relations and domestic politics of Southeast Asia. I am the first winner of this prize.

My book, *Stepping Out: The Making of Chinese Entrepreneurs*, won the 1994 National Book Development Council Award, Singapore. In 1999, it was made into a 30-episode Chinese TV serial by the Television Corporation of Singapore (TCS, Channel 8), which won 5 major awards, including Best Television Drama Serial, Best Actor, and Best Actress. A television drama book by Longman and a VCD on the television serial were produced in 2000. The book has been translated into Chinese in 1996 by China Social Sciences Publishing House (中國社會科學出版社).
